- Today's Topic: **Workplace Evangelism: Ask for the Order!**



Jesus answered and said unto him, Verily, verily, I say unto thee, Except a man be born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God. --John 3:3

Marvel not that I said unto thee, Ye must be born again. --John 3:7

Being born again, not of corruptible seed, but of incorruptible, by the word of God, which liveth and abideth for ever. --1 Peter 1:23

As we go about our daily worklives, how do we share the good news with people in our spheres of influence? Here are some tips:

PRAY FOR WISDOM. What you don't want to be is a bull in a china shop. You should be enthusiastic. You should be eager to share the hope that lies within. But, you should share the Gospel wisely by being respectful of people's freedom to choose to believe or not to believe, aware of the limits of your freedom of speech rights, and sensitive to the promptings of the Holy Spirit. If you ask for wisdom, God will give it to you (James 1:5-8).

HAVE EVANGELISTIC TOOLS HANDY THAT ARE RELEVANT TO DAILY LIFE. Somewhere in your workspace (desk, bureau, cabinet, vehicle), put together a small "ministry resource center" with Christian materials that pertain to everyday living such as work, family, health and finances. Keep a small supply of Bibles, too (1 Peter 3:15).

BE PREPARED TO SHARE YOUR TESTIMONY AND THE GOSPEL "CRISPLY." Many Christians fumble and mumble when asked to share their personal testimony of salvation and the simple Gospel. Practice giving your testimony and the Gospel, and tweak it until it's crisp. Consider publishing your personal testimony online, in print, on CD, mp3, or in speaking engagements. Always be prepared to "ask for the order." We do it in business, we should do it in evangelism (Ephesians 6:15).
