Do you recall the conference room scene in the movie "Liar, Liar" with Jim Carey? It's one of my all-time favorite movie scenes. Conservatively speaking, I estimate that I've participated in over 10,000 meetings during my career. I've worked with hundreds of clients. At times, navigating through politics and bureaucracies has been very challenging!
